

Currently, ninety-eight (98) percent of our high school graduates have pursued a university career, while the remaining two (2) percent have followed a professional athletic career. Many factors, such as major area of study, high school grades, SAT and TOEFL results, scholarships, personal finances, and athletic ability can determine where a student may attend university. Parents and students should be advised that ES American School does not prepare students for the Spanish *"Selectividad"* exam. Graduates of ES American School may apply to take the *"Selectividad para Extranjeros"* if they wish to enter Spanish universities.

- 1. Payments should be made in advance each semester, on August 31 and December 31.
- 2. There is a **"Family Reduction Plan"** of a 5% reduction of <u>tuition only</u> and 20% reduction of <u>legacy fee only</u> for the next sister or brother enrolled at the same time at ES American School. Not applicable to Library or Activities.
- 3. Tuition reductions are not cumulative. Please consult with us for details.
- 4. There is a Graduation fee of 400€ for 12th grade students only.
- 5. Private tutorials are charged at 55€ per class.
- 6. Please consult with the ESA for fees related to optional services such as **Medical Insurance** (Included for ESA annual tennis players), **Student Residence Card Process**, **Student Residence Card Renewal**, and **NIE / EU Registry Process**.

RESERVATION DEPOSIT

RESERVATION DEPOSIT PAYMENT of €2,000 (payable 2 weeks after admission) is credited towards tuition, and textbooks and materials. The tuition portion is non-refundable, and the corresponding textbooks and materials fee is refundable only if the student withdraws before the first day of classes.

REFUND POLICY

Students who officially withdraw will be eligible to receive a refund of tuition and fees according to the following schedule:

VISA INFORMATION

Step 1

- 1. Once accepted to ES American School in Barcelona, you will receive an official acceptance letter.
- 2. Please send payment of the €2,000 **non-refundable** tuition deposit to ES American School in Barcelona.
- 3. Citizens of the European Union do not need a visa to study in Spain.

Step 2

Please contact the Visa Section of the nearest Spanish Consulate to determine if the applicant will need a Student Visa. Depending on the consulate, it takes approximately one to two months to obtain a student visa. Please apply early. Requirements vary from country to country. If a student visa is required, it must be procured in the student's country of permanent residence prior to travelling to Spain. It is not possible to change a Tourist Visa to a Student Visa once in Spain.

The visa application requirements may vary from country to country; however, the Spanish authorities normally emphasize the need for:

- » Visa application (to be provided by the Consulate)
- » Proof that the student has adequate funds to study in Spain. A statement of financial support for the period of study in Spain. A sworn affidavit of support by the parents or guardians, or a financial bank statement showing a minimum income of €1,000 (one thousand euros) per month for the student's stay in Spain.
- » Health Certificate (medical certificate from physician).
- » Proof of medical insurance coverage (not just accident insurance), stating that all medical expenses of the student will be covered during his or her stay in Spain. Our school can optionally provide you with insurance that will comply.
- » The admission letter to ES American School in Barcelona. In most cases, consular authorities will ask for a letter in Spanish from the school confirming enrollment. In other words, that the student has been admitted, including the specific dates and number of hours per week and the type and level of studies to be completed in Spain. The Head of School will send you this enrollment confirmation after payment of the tuition deposit.
- » A notarized Parental Authorization letter by which the student is permitted to travel to Spain to live and study for a specific period of time.
- In some cases, Spanish authorities may require pre-payment of a full academic year before they may consider visa applications. If tuition pre-payment is required, please proceed to forward payment following the instructions provided with the acceptance letter. Once payment is received, we will provide a letter for the Embassy confirming the amount paid. Paying the full fees for the entire year is a good way to show that the student's parents are financially sound. Parents also receive a tuition reduction for paying the entire year in advance.
- » The Embassy may ask for proof of accommodation while in Spain. In the case that the school arranges accommodation with a host family, payment in advance of five (5) months of accommodation is required before we can send the necessary document to the Embassy. Please contact Mr. Carlos Lizardi, Director of Admissions, at <u>clizardi@esschool.com</u> for more details. Students attending a tennis program at Emilio Sánchez Academy must arrange accommodation directly through the Academy. The Academy will also provide the necessary documents for the visa.

Please note that if the visa application is denied or if the student decides not to attend before classes begin, we will return the tuition payment (and accommodation fees, if applicable) <u>except</u> the non-refundable tuition deposit. This deposit will only be reimbursed if the parents provide us with <u>written proof</u> from the Embassy indicating that the student visa was denied.

Once in Barcelona the student must obtain a <u>Student Residence Card</u> (unless he or she is a European Union national). To obtain this card, the student must bring the following:

- » A valid passport.
- » A student visa type "D" stamped on the passport by the Spanish Consulate.
- » Have an immigration entry date stamp on the passport showing the date of entry into Spain or the European Union. (Please insist that the student must get this immigration entry date stamped on the passport upon entry at the airport!)
- » Proof of medical insurance stating that all medical expenses will be covered during the student's stay in Spain.
- » Notarized Parental Authorization letter in Spanish signed by both parents stating that the student is permitted to travel to Spain to live and study for a specific period of time. (Our school can provide a sample letter for this purpose.)
- » Photocopy of both parents' passports including the page showing their signatures.
- » Enrollment confirmation letter (to be provided by the school)
- » Proof of domicile from the head of the student's host family or the ES Academy if staying on campus (to be obtained when in Barcelona)
- » Four passport size pictures with white background.
